For the Academic year 2012 we thank God's goodness in His providential care and blessings, guidance and health, and a heartfelt appreciation for the financial support you all rendered to us in God's grace. Our student body peaked at 209 Primary and 7 secondary kids. We added many activities such as trips,





special English classes, spiritual life activities (teaching the Westminster catechism, Christian Religious Education based on Biblical lessons) including Watoto's special Bible school (songs, Bible lessons, dancing and games), or the joinder with Exodus (pastor Sam's Christian School in the preaching of the Word and special music. And all were delighted who dared a Camel ride. 17 KG kids loved the last day of school as now they







get to study and play the whole day at Day Spring (graduates). A special SMI Investment will greet the KG kids – a new ride. Livingston, our Christian Brother, Livingston, who is now 88 – has a new beginning, a new house with a real bed and table and chair. All kids had a "beach sand play area", with new equipment for the little ones. Certain KG, Primary and one Secondary (7 still at Future Leaders College) were delighted when they achieved the No 1 position in the class and were eligible and received 50,000 Ugx (\$20) as a reward for their hard work (below listed):

P7 Primary Leaving exams will be released next week, and we trust our program for early morning and the after- hours evening sessions will prove good results. And as noted above, through special directed giving, teachers (even all staff) were rewarded at the end of the year with a general bonus (about ½ of a month salary) and an end of the year performance bonus where some received a s much as 2x monthly salary, and most teachers at least 1x salary on December 7, 2012 (just before Christmas). Not all was rosy: 3 teachers were terminated, two staff members received warning letters, the patron resigned and the Bus driver was fired for bad behavior while on duty driving our new Van. Two teachers were accused of examination/grading malpractice but investigation (even by myself) found the accusations to be baseless.

Sports, Games and Physical Education were implemented at all levels. Day Spring's boy's football team was not

active/very directed-organized Chris (my son) here collaborated organized some practices and internal competitions, and the team went out and played Kitiko Primary winning by 6 goals (8 – 2) on our now affectionately called by people "the killing field". Day Spring has not lost at home.
