It was truly a remarkable year and your PARTNERSHIP with us. We are thankful to all of you for records attributed to all. Here are some:

- 1. Day Spring Revenues of 445 million Ugx (\$116,000) up 85%
- 2. Students from four nations, South Sudan sending the largest contingent, of 70 out of 251 students (ending with 241)
- 3. Still Debt Free while investing about 115 million Ugx (\$46,000) for additions to infrastructure.
- 4. Day Spring's full or partial sponsorship of over 40 orphans or poor children.
- 5. National Primary Leaving Exam Center, 1st seating for 15 students

Notes to Financials: Although Donations to SMI were down 7% over 2010, Operating Expenses for the 2nd and 3rd Terms included additional donations (\$5,000 each) for DSCA staff designated bonuses paid out in August and November. SMI funding of DSCA was 81% of 2012. Day Spring CA Fee revenue was up 85% over 2012. Project investment approaches \$1.3 million since 2005.

DSCA Construction Expense was 300% of 2012, drainage system, septic system and Library/TOP class inclusive

Private personal funds were used to acquire a Land Rover.

Here than are some of the project development efforts during the school year:

New Bench tops (writing surfaces) and HS benches - ~\$ 5,000 Choir Robes - ~ \$500 Remodeled Chapel, Bell and Chairs etc. -~ \$14,000 New Septic system, showers for added students, and TOP Class/Library Building - ~ \$ \$25,000

To Sum Up:

New Top Class building and Library, facilities for baby care, moved and relocated the Library out of Administrative building and purchase new chairs (25) for TOP class. Added were the

7 shower spaces (4 girls and 3 boys), with two new septic pits for added students. The High School received new benches and chairs for each class room. The Second Term brought the major renovation of our chapel dining area and a special thanks to Chris Mooibroek (Timmerman Custom Homes, McKinney, Texas -USA) who provided major project funding and came to labor and teach our construction crew and donated a new large Refrigerator Freezer to aid in our food service to the students and (yes no 1 quality posho and porridge, beans, rice chicken, beef, vegetables, etc.), three new laptop computers. The Third Term we crowned the Chapel with a new bell for Day Spring Christian Church and Christian School. That and more for the infrastructure development costs of \$46,000 coming from SMI and private donors. Now the other news

Our **Spiritual life** is served by **Christian Religious Education**, Catechism from the Westminster

Confession of Faith, and Classroom Bible studies, with Wednesday and Sunday Services.





Day Spring's Library strengthens students language skills with comprehension and diction. The evening classes are open to all and provides supplementary support for the student's studies.

We enforce **discipline** through monitoring of students by class leaders, teachers, guards, patron and matrons, who teach Moral Values and **respect for property** (a few students were dismissed because of severe property damage and failure to respect campus authority). Because of performance (changes of three Teachers and Bursar), and severe **damage to one of our vehicles** (driving w/o authority and w/o a license), we have staff changes of one Security Guard.

Challenges: 1. We have an increasing need for **dormitory and kindergarten space** (both are in temporary facilities/class rooms, and for High School may have to be located off-site)

With new enrollments we may have to resort to **bank borrowing to build new space**

We need high school student Library books for reference and personal assistance
Piano Music lessons for students are to be added (space and practice instrument needs) and swimming lessons
Financial controls to be added such as bank payment of fees and uniform costs

5. Add new **administrative housing** for Director and missionaries.
